The monotype was selected by juror Dwight Pogue, director and founder of the printmaking department at Smith College. Ann is now working on palm drawings using the brush as a drawing tool and experimenting with mixed media. Patricia A. Other prize winners were Gallery Artists Nancy Howell, Wendy Hale, Maureen Brookfield, Virginia Wilson and Judy Rossman.
